11. Pedagogical Solutions


Planning

A template of the Annual plan, Lesson plan & Weekly plan is given to all the teachers.



12. Environmental Protection Activities

1. Cleaning the area in front of the school.:

In June, the students and the staff of the Kalyani School will be engaged in cleaning the area in front of the school. The nullah that runs there has troubled everyone for a long time, because local people have been heedlessly dumping plastic material and household garbage, including glass and metal into it. The area has become infested with harmful insects and emitted a bad odour. So, the Kalyaniites will take it upon themselves to do the needful and clean the area. At the end of the drive, the place will look much cleaner, and would perhaps inspire the local people to keep it that way. The effort of the Kalyaniites will be commendable and the students especially will feel a sense of accomplishment after doing it.

2. The river clean up and plantation drive in Kharadi and Kavadi Pat Wetlands:

The Kalyaniites do it all. Along with their studies, they are quite determined to do something meaningful, to make this world a healthy place to live in. They know the raging environmental concerns, and that it is everyone's responsibility to make sure that the health and beauty of Mother Earth is restored and maintained. Keeping that in mind, in the month of August, our children of Grades V-XII, will participate in the river cleanup and plantation drive in Kharadi and the Kavadi Pat Wetlands, to help restore the wetlands. They also will take out a rally in the nearby areas, to raise awareness amongst the people about the importance of keeping our water bodies clean. They will collect plastic, metal and garbage in separate bags. The Kalyaniites have pledged to keep such efforts going, until they make a positive difference in the environment.

3. Measures taken by school to ensure sustainability of each project year on year:

We are extremely conscious of our responsibilities towards our surroundings. This has led us into initiating and sustaining environment or eco-friendly projects and products, as an institution, as well as inculcating the same values in our students. Some of our projects aligning with the same are as follows:

Composting: We collect wet garbage from our cafeteria and classrooms. This is then used for making compost. Our gardens and lawn use the final product as organic manure.

Digitisation: Most of our processes and documentation are digitised, so as to avoid wastage of paper. We try our best to keep paper usage to the bare minimum by encouraging our students and staff to recycle and reuse.

Water Harvesting: We understand the need and necessity to conserve water and hence we have introduced water harvesting as a part of our Environmental Education curriculum. Our students have designed projects based on the same and understand the working of these projects. Our assemblies are also around these topics, which further help our students to learn and understand the importance of saving water, through various means.

Water and Energy Audits: Students of Grades VIII & IX keep track of the usage of water by checking for leaking taps and faucets. They also speak to the younger students about the importance of saving water in every way possible.

Monitors are appointed for energy audits, from each class. They ensure that all computers, smart boards, fans and lights are switched off when not in use.

QR Coding of Trees: Our students, along with the teachers have begun the QR Coding of trees in the school campus. On scanning the code, one can learn about the use and importance of a particular tree.

Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs): The Kalyaniites are trying their best to follow the Sustainable Development Goals set up by the United Nations. They address the global challenges we face, including poverty, inequality, climate change, environmental degradation, peace & justice, etc.

Festivals and other celebrations: Our enthusiastic parents are our largest pool of resources. Very often they conduct workshops for our students teaching them to make colour pigments out of vegetables, fruits, leaves and flowers. Our curriculum also ensures that our students are taught to make eco-friendly Ganesha idols, rakhis, paper patakas and decorative buntings. This enables us to celebrate festivals responsibly.

Earn For Your Country: To encourage our students to value dignity of labour, we have introduced 'Earn for Your Country' — a money box project. Our students collect the money that they get as a reward for doing odd jobs or chores, from their parents or neighbours. The money collected is accumulated in the school, at the end of the academic year. This is then used by the school, to rebuild or improve a municipality school in the neighbourhood

14. Remediation Plan (Academics)

14.1 Academic Support

Requirement of academic support and remedial classes

Academic support is provided to students, based on their performance in each term. Grades I & II have their support classes during school hours and Grades III-XII stay back for academic support on Wednesdays and Fridays. The teachers prepare an action plan with the help of the coordinators and the subject heads, taking into consideration the need of each child.

14.2. After School Activities

Sports activities teach students to set realistic goals and build their confidence. The after-school sports activities at TKS are, Gymnastics, Basketball, Football, Cricket, Karate, Handball, Athletics, Skating.

15. Staff Capacity Building

15.1 Assessment training needs of teachers and staff at all level Identification of training needs:

TKS ensures that all staff have access to learning, development and training opportunities which enable them to be suitably knowledgeable and skilled to carry out their role within the School.

The responsibility for identifying training and development needs and carrying out agreed training and development activities, lies with the School Training Nodal Coordinator (STNC), AcCors and VPs.

AcCors/VPs provide support and guidance in relation to the training and development of those reporting to them, particularly in relation to the identification of training and development needs. STNC makes sure that appropriate and timely action is taken.

- An all-inclusive training and Capacity Building calendar of the school to achieve improved learning outcomes by students is designed and implemented.
- STNC coordinates closely with the respective District Training Coordinator and COE regarding conducting of programmes.
- Individual teachers' progress is assessed and reviewed and liaising with COE happens to ensure that effective solutions are jointly provided as per need.
- Detailed accurate written records of training and Capacity Building conducted in school or outside in respect of each teacher is maintained.
- In addition to the above, the school gets their teachers trained by other expert teacher training institutions.
- The staff gets feedback on a regular basis from the AcCors / HOD / V.P. / Principal

• Each and every staff member is reviewed annually during the appraisals and the management has a one to one discussion with them to provide a timely and effective feedback for enhancing their performance.

16. Students' Well-Being

The well-being of our students at The Kalyani School:

We prioritise the safety of our students in school. We have taken all the precautious and required measurements to ensure that our students and staff are safe in school. We have CCTV cameras in all locations in the school which include the cafeteria, sports grounds, classrooms, and school buses.

We have ground staff which include our security officers, Didis and Bhaiyas. Our attendants are vigilant and stationed outside all the bathrooms, and attendants in the bus to and from school.

We have installed safety systems and Fire Safety drills are conducted regularly. We have health check-ups regularly for our students and staff. We have safety guidelines for our students along with POCSO workshops for all stake holders.

✓ 16.1 Guidelines for students' safety:

- ✓ The students have the ID card, and the parents have to have an out card when they fetch their ward.
- ✓ No minor student is left alone. There will always be an attendant, security guard or teacher with him/her.
- ✓ Cameras are installed facing all entry and exit points of the school, corridors, sports grounds, labs, classrooms, auditorium halls, library and school buses.
- ✓ In any emergency situation, the parent is called to school immediately.
- ✓ All classes, whether in the art room, playground, cafeteria, classrooms, are diligently monitored.
- ✔ Floor duty and dispersal duty are given to the teachers to monitor the students.
- ✓ We have positive reinforcement protocols that we follow in school, and corporal punishment is not tolerated at TKS.
- ✓ The Pastoral care at TKS have counsellors and remedial teachers to take care of the mental health and behavioural concerns related to students.
- ✓ At TKS, we have frequent meetings with all the stakeholders regarding issues concerning safety matters of the students and feedback from the staff is also taken on a regular basis.
- ✓ Verified documents and background checks of staff and vendors in transport, security and canteen is carried out.
- ✓ We have the Parent Executive group that conveys all-important decisions to the other parents.

16.2 Health care in school:

- ✓ At TKS we have regular health and medical check-ups for students and staff.
- ✓ A full-time school nurse is available, along with an emergency strategy in place, with the nearby hospital.
- ✓ We conduct talks and workshops on hygiene and different aspects of health.

- In The Kalyani School we follow a 3 way handshake between the students, teachers and parents.
- There is continuous Professional Development of Teachers and a very huge budget is allotted for their trainings, which are conducted throughout the year.
- The Teachers are well trained and groomed in the culture of 'TKS' and hence the students and parents are made very comfortable in approaching all the stakeholders of the school.
- A lot of systems and procedures are in place

Areas of improvements:

- The school has started an innovation club, but its activities need to be made interesting by inviting guests from eminent field to speak and motivate our students.
- Encourage teachers and students to come together to innovate in the tinkering Lab
- Allot a time after school for researching in the tinkering lab with a teacher guide.
