We tip our hats to these sports champs, and wish them all the best for their future matches too.





On 31st of October, the Grade II students enjoyed making torans in their Math Experiential Learning class, where they used and learned about, different shapes. There was also a visit from parents, who came to discuss and plan the projects and activities for the signature event, 'Mad About India'. The team started with the Goa Heritage Walk, which gave them an insight into the Indo-Portuguese culture. They had a live experience of Latin music; did sketching and painting in an Art Gallery, and tasted delicious sweets at the Goan Heritage Bakery. The children also had an opportunity to attend the 'Young Ecologist Programme' to learn about 'Wild Otters'. They were thrilled to have a hands-on experience of Camera Trapping and making Bat Boxes.



A highlight of the trip was the 'Kayaking' activity at the Holland Beach which not only provided a thrilling experience but also instilled teamwork and communication skills among the students. They were engaged in some interesting activities too, such as making 'sand castles' with friends, beach games at the Bogmolo Beach, souvenir shopping and a musical night. All the students relished the authentic food at the 'Kokum Curry' restaurant in Panjim. At the 'Salim Ali Bird Sanctuary' they learnt some valuable lessons on Mangroves, and were exposed to the rich biodiversity of the region.







### Outstation Trips 2023

The students of Grades VII and VIII, went to Ahmedabad for their trip. Here too, they had an opportunity to get rid of all their academic stress, have endless fun and to bond outside the classroom. The several historical and cultural landmarks they visited, gave them a unique learning experience and exposure to the very fascinating aspects of this historical city.









They visited the Sabarmati Ashram, and learnt about the Gandhian philosophy of community service and sustainable living, while tracing the Ashram's historic links back to the Indian Freedom Struggle. They also had the opportunity to see the Vintage Car Museum, which was indeed a spectacular experience. They explored the architecture of Lothal, one of the most prominent cities of the ancient Indus Valley Civilization, now situated in the Bhāl region of the modern state of Gujarāt. They took a guided tour to understand the lifestyle of that period. The visits to the other heritage sites, like the Adalaj Stepwell, Utensils Museum, Vikram Sarabhai Space Exhibition (ISRO), were equally enjoyed by each student.





### Outstation Trips 2023

The students of Grades IX to XII, went to Rajasthan's two famous cities, Jodhpur and Jaisalmer. There, they explored the historical Mehrangarh Fort, gaining insights into the rich heritage and architectural marvels of the region. At Umaid Bhavan Palace, they saw an impressive collection of clocks, photographs of the elegant art-deco interior of the palace and the classic cars of the Maharajas. Through the visit to the Jaisalmer War Museum, they learned about the war efforts and history of the Indian Army. A highlight of the trip was the exploration of the Jaisalmer Fort, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, where the students were exposed to the medieval history of the region. An excursion to the Sam Sand Dunes allowed students to experience the unique desert landscape and enjoy cultural performances, including folk music and dance. The last day of the trip, special Farewell Night and Pastry Party was arranged by Indian Odyssey which made the trip memorable.
